Present Owner: J. A. Vaughn, from 1926 to date.
J. R. Martin, from 1920 to 1926.
Dr. S. C. Carson, 1900 to 1920.
Gov. Seay, from 1880 to 1896.
His wife lived there until 1900.
Gov. Seay bought the house from
Mr. Kennedy and remodeled same
about 1875.

Date of Erection: 1825.

Architect: Unknown.

Builder: Mr. Kennedy.

Present Condition: Very good, has recently been painted
and covered with sheet metal roof within the
past two years.

Number of Stories: Two.

Materials of Construction: Frame house, brick pillar
foundation, sheet metal roof, exterior walls
are of poplar drop siding and weatherboarding,
interior walls are plastered and in good condition.
Floors are of $\frac{3}{4}$ " by 6" heart of pine.

Additional Data: During Mr. Martins ownership, the
place was altered. The original front facing
Main Street was changed to face a side street,
the front yard is now occupied by a Standard
Oil Co. filling station, the business district
having extended to this location. The original
law office now sets on the opposite side of the
street.
