ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

This modest house of city character has a small one storey Ionic porch on the front. The second floor exterior door formerly opened upon a shallow balcony built on the porch roof. Plaster is used on the ceilings and back walls of all the porches. An unusual feature is the cove cornice of plaster on the south porch.

The plaster ceiling of the parlor is rich in anthemions and rinceaux.
