History: Built in 1855. A native of Austria he came to California in 1849 and married the daughter of Juan P. Bernal in 1850. Moved to Alisal (Pleasanton) in 1855 and erected the adobe on the south bank of Arroya Valle, opposite Bernal's residence. He was one of the founders of Pleasanton and opened the first store there. Building now destroyed.

Description: One-story and loft, gable ends and two dormers set back in shake roof. Shed roof over veranda supported by double wood posts with lattice work between and eaves ornamented with ban-sawn scallops. Adobe wall at front plastered and protected with rustic elsewhere.
