History: Military post established in 1852 to protect miners from marauding Indians and named for Major Albert S. Miller. Evacuated in 1856 and re-activated in 1863 during Civil War but finally abandoned in 1864.

Description: One-story structure with steep hipped shingle roof and with shake roof over porch and kitchen wing. Two fireplace chimneys symmetrically located at ridge. Wall construction probably adobe similar to other buildings.
