
Present Condition: Well preserved, being the residence of Pedro Lugo, a great grandson of the original owner. There appears to be but little change in the structure as originally built.

Number of Stories: Two

Materials of Construction: Field stone foundations; sun-dried adobe brick walls, plastered both sides; wood floors, roof construction and balconies; shingled roof, and all woodwork painted.

Additional Data: The house is a good example of the Southern California style of two story adobe ranch houses. The Rancho San Antonio, of 29,513 acres, was confirmed and patented to Antonio Maria Lugo in 1866.
