EXTERIOR FEATURES OF NOTE This cottage retains its original small entry porch, unlike its twin, 212 Palm Street (HABS No. CA-2212, Albert Hayman Cottage). The principal bargeboards, however, are identical. The cross-gable dormer window has not been clipped, unlike the Hayman cottage.

MAJOR ALTERATIONS AND ADDITIONS WITH DATES The front bay window is not original.		
PRESENT CONDITION AND USE good condition -- antique store		
OTHER INFORMATION AS APPROPRIATE This building and 212 Palm Street (HABS No. CA-2212, Albert Hayman Cottage) are twins, probably constructed by the same builder or from the same patternbook. Unlike the Hayman cottage, this structure retains its bargeboards.
