CA-2266-1            Contextual aerial view of bridge in setting; view to south-southwest.  
Beyond the Junction Bridge is the elevated Bay Area Rapid Transit  
(BART) structure, with the Oakland Army Terminal at upper right

CA-2262-2            North leg of bridge from Southern Pacific Railroad, showing approach fill  
and trestle at left, steel girder main spans at center/right center, and south  
leg of bridge just visible in background; view to south

CA-2262-3            View along deck of north leg approach spans; view to south. Inner pair of  
tracks are termed guard rails, placed to prevent derailed cars from riding  
over the side of the bridge. Second track was originally in vacant ballasted  
area at right of remaining track

CA-2262-5            Detail, deck of south leg timber trestle approach spans, showing partially  
collapsed deck section; view to north
