SIGNIFICANCE (ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL, INCLUDE ORIGINAL USE OF STRUCTURE) Structure No. 2 is part of the three existing Lincoln School Structures which are local significant as unusual examples of Mission Style architecture exhibiting the Prairie School influence. They are the only known examples of this quality in the style in Greeley, Colorado.

MATERIAL OF CONSTRUCTION (INCLUDE STRUCTURAL SYSTEMS) Yellow Poured concrete foundation, yellow, smooth faced, solid brick construction. Structural system consists of wood joist floor framing and wood trusses for roof framing.		
SHAPE AND DIMENSIONS OF STRUCTURE (SKETCHED FLOOR PLANS ON SEPARATE PAGES ARE ACCEPTABLE) Rectangular in shape with over all dimensions, 56'-0" x 46' -10"		
EXTERIOR FEATURES OF NOTE One-story plus basement solid brick building in the Mission style with the Prairie school influence. Concrete porch and stoop slabs with hip roof and wide overhang supported by decorative rafter extensions. (See photographs)
