Present Condition: Excellent. The front stoop is reproduction of original. The rear porch has been extended but not materially altered. The kitchen which was separate has been moved up and made an addition to the house. The picket fence as it now stands is an extension of the old fence.

Materials of Construction: Foundation brick, wood floors, exterior walls frame, shingle hip roof.

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ARCHITECTURAL NOTES:

This two storey frame house of the Early Republican period has the elliptical arch motif in three different places: at the front door, at the second floor door to the decked porch, and in the hallway, separating the reception hall from the back or stair hall. The hand-rail of the main stairs rises in an elliptical curve to the second floor.

The kitchen building was originally about fifty feet at the rear of the mansion. It has been moved and joined to the southwest side of the house by a modern passageway.
