Owner: Mrs. Jessie Kirkland.Date of Erection: House about 1885; Ironwork almost certainly before 1860.Architect - Builder:Present Condition: Ironwork must have been taken from another house; - is painted and in good condition.Number of Stories: House two stories.Materials of Construction: Ironwork is cast iron. Porch one story.Other Existing Records:Additional Data: House of no interest architecturally. Ironwork in front of good Greek design held in place by wood posts and rails. Posts with beveled corners $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3".

Mr. E. O. Smith, Architect, Columbus, Georgia suggests the iron work might have been imported from abroad. This iron work used as a pattern for Straus Hall, Warm Springs, Georgia by Henry Toombs, Architect.

The original owner was Downing. Mrs. Kirkland has owned place for 12 years.
