Additional Data: Double decked veranda. Well designed and executed woodwork and mantels. Three stairways--one in center portion and one in each wing. Built by Felix and William Gilbert.



(GILBERT) ALEXANDER (~~WRIGHT~~) House, Washington,
Wilkes County, Georgia.

Two story and attic brick plantation dwelling.
Double decked veranda. Early Republic. Interesting
well-designed and well-executed wood-work and mantels.
Three stairways, one in the center portion, one in
each wing. Center portion of the house was built on
an extensive plantation adjacent to Washington by
Felix and William Gilbert who moved from Rockingham
County, Virginia to this plantation in 1808.

Sarah Gilbert, daughter of Felix Gilbert,
married Adam Leopold Alexander from Sunbury, Midway
Neck, Liberty County, Georgia, who added first the
west wing of brick and later the east wing of frame.

The place is now owned and occupied by
Mrs. James Goude Wright, a descendant of Adam Leo -
pold Alexander.
