COLEMAN HOUSE, Macon, Bibb County, Georgia.

Two story, brick stuccoed, portico with
eighteen Doric columns on three facades.

"Garden History of Georgia", page 88, states
that the house was built about 1838 by Jerry Cowles,
prominent citizen of Macon.

Designed by Elam Alexander who was known as
an architect and contractor.

The place has been owned successively by
Jerry Cowles, Joseph Bond, Samuel Taylor Coleman, *Joseph*
Warren Cabaness and the present owner and occupant,
B.P.O'Neal.
