Materials of Construction: Foundation field stone, wood floors, hand hewn log exterior walls, hand split shingle roof. Outside chimneys of stone.

Other Existing Records: Records by P. Thornton Marye, District Officer, H.A.B.S. 1934.

Additional Data: Built by Major James Cochran, a pioneer from Virginia. This house was headquarters of Andrew Jackson 1812 when blazing the "Jackson Trail." Again used by Jackson in 1814 and 1815 in command of Tennessee Volunteers to protect settlers from hostile Indians. Now un-occupied.
