Significance:

Building No. 186 is rated a Category 3 historical building. A Category 3 building is defined as only of minor importance to the historic character of Pearl Harbor. Building No. 186 is located within the Pearl Harbor National Historic Landmark, which has historical significance due to the calamitous events of 7 December 1941 and its vital role in supporting the nation's subsequent war effort in the Pacific theater of World War II.

Description:

The building is a one and two story wooden structure with the mess area/cooks quarters in the one story wing and the living quarters in the two story wing.

History:

The building constructed circa 1941, was originally designed for 88 bachelor officers housed in the two story wing and the mess area/cooks quarters in the one story wing. The extension appears to be accomplished immediately by extending the two story wings in both directions to increase capacity to 170 officers. The building was later used as a bachelor enlisted quarters, a legal hold (housing for enlisted personnel undergoing legal action but not requiring detention), and finally a YMCA. The U.S. Naval Base at Pearl Harbor was designated as a National Historic Landmark in 1964.

Building is presently used as an Armed Forces YMCA. Military Construction Project, P-443, proposes to build a Transient Personnel Unit and the demolition of the building is included in the project.



