
Significance: The U.S. Naval Base at Pearl Harbor was designated as a National Historic Landmark in 1964. As a Category 3 facility, it has been determined that Building No. 468 functioned as part of the Pearl Harbor Naval Base, but is only of minor importance to the historic character of the National Historic Landmark.

Description: Building No. 468 is a two-story wood structure on a concrete slab located at Jarvis Street and Kuahua Avenue. The area of the building is approximately 8,500 square feet.

History: Building No. 468 was constructed in 1921 as a print shop and photo lab. The first floor was used as work space with receiving and delivery area. The second floor had a multilith room, enlisted men's quarters, officer's quarter, a dark room and a camera room. In 1962, the building was converted to be a district intelligence office. In 1964, the building was changed into an office for NAVCOSSAC. The building is currently used as an administration building. Plans for demolition of the existing building are included in Military Construction (MCON) Project P-115, which proposes to demolish the existing building and construct a new Intermediate Maintenance Activity (IMA) Facility.
