Significance: The U.S. Naval Base, Pearl Harbor was designated as a National Historic Landmark in 1964; due to the crucial role it played in the Nation's defense during the twentieth century and the calamitous events which occurred on December 7, 1941. As a Category 3 structure, it is determined that Building No. 678 functioned as a part of the Pearl Harbor Naval Base, but is only of minor importance to the historic character of the National Landmark.


Description: Building No. 67B is a single story, 28 feet high, 100 feet wide and 400 feet long. The building is constructed of wood on a reinforced concrete slab with corrugated metal siding and roofing.

History: Building 678 was constructed in 1942 as a Storehouse for submarine space parts at a cost of \$370,267. In 1961, the south half of the building was converted to a Bowling Alley and a Pool Room. However, in 1990, that half of the building was demolished by Military Construction (MCON) Project P-0B5 which constructed another Bowling Alley at the Submarine Base. Presently, the building is utilized as Maintenance Shops for the maintenance of the Submarine Base common areas and the water front areas.


