- Significance: The U.S. Naval Base, Pearl Harbor was designated as a National Historic Landmark in 1964; due to the crucial role it played in the Nation's defense during the twentieth century and the calamitous events which occurred on December 7, 1941. As a Category 3 structure, it is determined that Building No. 692 functioned as a part of the Pearl Harbor Naval Base, but is only of minor importance to the historic character of the National Landmark.
- Description: Building No. 692 is a single story, 25 feet high, 130 feet wide and 400 feet long. The building is constructed of wood on a reinforced concrete slab with corrugated metal roofing.
- History: Building 692, a Storehouse, was built in 1943 at a cost of \$285,5B7. Building 692 was a part of a Shop Facilities Project, constructed to support the Pacific Submarine Fleet. In 1956, a portion of the north section of the building was converted to office spaces. Presently, the building is utilized as a General Warehouse.
