GEORGE SPANGERBERGER FARMSTEAD, EAST TOOL SHED

HABS No. KS-77-F

Location: The East Tool Shed is located at 2012 W. Illinois Ave., north of the Spangerberger Farmstead residence, northeast of the claim house and chicken house, and east of the west tool shed, South Hutchinson Vicinity, Reno County, Kansas.

Present Owners: Kansas Department of Transportation

Present Occupant: None

Present Use: Vacant Outbuilding

Significance: The east tool shed contributes to the historic character of the George Spangerberger Farmstead.

Description: Two small tool sheds are located 63' north of the main residence and approximately 29' northeast of the claim house. Both small storage units have a southern orientation. They are situated approximately 4'-6" apart in the same line. Both tool sheds were constructed ca. 1940.

The George Spangerberger Farmstead east tool shed is the larger of the two sheds. This one story outbuilding measures approximately 18'-6" x 8'-0" and features a corrugated sheet metal shed roof which slopes down to the north. It is clad in clapboard siding on the south, east, and west walls with corner boards on the south facade. The north wall of the east tool shed is covered with corrugated metal siding on the exterior and with wall board on the interior. The south facade of this tool shed has a vertical board door to the west and a small, fixed, two-light rectangular window to the east. There are no other doors or windows in this shed. The shed, which rests on brick footings, has a board floor. The door stoop consists of a wood ramp.

The East Tool Shed is in good condition.




Historian: Sheryll L. White was the historian for the Spangerberger Farmstead project. White


SITE PLAN SHOWING THE LOCATION OF THE
