4. TULIP HILL. One of the country's finest Georgian houses and an old friend to thousands of Pilgrimage visitors, *Tulip Hill* was built in 1756 by Samuel Galloway. The house is rich in detail from its entrance portico with Cupid in its pediment to the great hall where a graceful stairway rises between two arches flanked by an exception-

ally beautiful corner cupboard. A simple shell hood crowns the garden doorway and, below it, three steep terraces fall away to West River and the Bay. The great tulip poplar trees which give the house its name serve today, as they did 200 years ago, as landmarks for sailors on the Bay. George Washington dined here in 1771 with his friend Samuel Galloway on his way to the races in Annapolis. The house is magnificently furnished with English and Chinese antiques. *Tulip Hill* is a designated National Historic Landmark. Owners: Mr. and Mrs. Lewis R. Andrews.
