SIGNIFICANCE (ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL, INCLUDE ORIGINAL USE OF STRUCTURE) This building is typical of late nineteenth century Baltimore row houses built on secondary or alley streets. It retains an attractive cornice, but other elements such as doors and windows have been altered.		
STYLE (IF APPROPRIATE)		
MATERIAL OF CONSTRUCTION (INCLUDE STRUCTURAL SYSTEMS) Brick set in stretcher bond.		
SHAPE AND DIMENSIONS OF STRUCTURE (SKETCHED FLOOR PLANS ON SEPARATE PAGES ARE ACCEPTABLE) Approximately 15' x 70' for each house.		
EXTERIOR FEATURES OF NOTE Bracketed cornice with ventilation panels and jig saw wood work. Segmentally arched lintels -- stretcher bricks on first floor and headers on second floor.		
INTERIOR FEATURES OF NOTE (DESCRIBE FLOOR PLANS, IF NOT SKETCHED) Interior has been altered for warehouse useage; no longer contains traditional row house floor plan.		
MAJOR ALTERATIONS AND ADDITIONS WITH DATES Converted to non-residential use c. 1945. Doors boarded; windows boarded with vents on second floor.		
PRESENT CONDITION AND USE Fair condition, but no longer representative of Baltimore row house because of alterations. Warehouse useage.		
OTHER INFORMATION AS APPROPRIATE Documentation of this structure was prepared because it will soon be demolished for a community medical center funded by an Urban Development Action Grant.
