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HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL NOTES:

The first certificate of entry from the United States for this property is to Pierre Bottineau on September 8, 1848. Then, on March 7, 1854, C.W. Farrington and his wife Mary deeded it to John Farrington. From the abstract it seems that the building was built by John Farrington in 1857.

It is not important historically, but is interesting architecturally. The openings of the brick façade are round-headed: some elliptical and others circular. The two elliptical arches and the two circular arches of the first floor form a kind of arcade on cast-iron columns. The three circular-headed second floor windows are more successful. They have interesting hood mouldings of projecting headers.
