Pierre Labadie purchased this land from Vilray Papin. Mr. Labadie was one of the early settlers in St. Louis and a very prominent merchant. He died in 1834 and left part of the land to his daughter Angelena, who married John Gobay.

The father of Pierre Labadie came from France in 1780 and formed a Fur Co., to trade with the Indians.

The property is still in the possession of the Gobay family.

This is a small one story brick house, gable roof with dormers. Wood window sills and wood lintels.

Poorly preserved.
