HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL INFORMATION

The following information was recorded by Alexander Piaget and Charles van Ravenswaay at the time the photograph was taken:

Built 1857-1860. The building was dedicated June 1860. Church is still standing, with minor alterations. This 1890 photograph shows original steeple.

This church associated with the Rev. Finis Ewing, who settled in the New Lebanon area about 1819-1820. His home stood just west of the church until it was torn down about 1939. The original house was of log, later replaced by a two-story brick house. The brick house was eventually made into a one-story structure. Ewing moved to Lexington, Mo. in 1832, where he died 4 July 1841

PROJECT INFORMATION

The Piaget-van Ravenswaay Survey consists of a number of photographs, primarily of sites and structures in Missouri, which were taken before 1938 by Alexander Piaget and after that by Paul Piaget, both in conjunction with Charles van Ravenswaay. Photographs of buildings were incorporated into the HABS collection in 1985 by Laura Rupp, HABS historian. A master list is available in the ~~records~~ records for MO-1800.
