HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL INFORMATION

The following information was recorded by Alexander Piaget and Charles van Ravenswaay at the time the photograph was taken:

Earliest section built adjoining Mt. Pleasant Winery ca. 1840s, later additions 1880s. Two and one-half story center section; one and one-half story wings. Frame construction, weatherboarded. Stone foundation. Local builder followed local design similar to other houses existing in the town. The wainscoting in the hall is original. The exposed joists and ceiling boards represent a common local building tradition. Stairway original.

Originally owned by George Muench. Owned in 1962 by William F. Baggerman.

PROJECT INFORMATION

The Piaget-van Ravenswaay Survey consists of a number of photographs, primarily of sites and structures in Missouri, which were taken before 1938 by Alexander Piaget and after that by Paul Piaget, both in conjunction with Charles van Ravenswaay. Photographs of buildings were incorporated into the HABS collection in 1985 by Laura Rupp and in 1986 by Deborah Fulton, HABS historians.
