ENGLEHART-WINNING AND COMPANY BUILDING HABS No. MO-1858

Location: 216-218 South Fourth Street, St. Joseph, Buchanan County, Missouri

Significance: Building housed activities of a wholesale concern important in the commercial history of St. Joseph; today it is one of few remaining structures from that era.

Description: Structure is four stories high on a stone foundation. Over the central front entrance is a two-story, semi-hexagonal bay window topped by a scrolled iron railing at the fourth story level. Terra cotta inset panels ornament the spandrels and the pilasters. An ornate pressed metal entablature separates the third and fourth stories, while a metal cornice tops the building. The cornice has brackets at its north and south ends. In between the end brackets of the cornice is a repeating frieze of arches, dentils, and sunburst designs.

History: Completed: 1884. Architect: Edmond Jacques Eckel. The building was occupied by Englehart-Winning and Company. For more information on that firm, see HABS No. MO-1857, Englehart-Winning and Company Building.
