




SIGNIFICANCE (ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL, INCLUDE ORIGINAL USE OF STRUCTURE) The Kingsway Center Area is locally significant for its architectural significance as an important representative illustration of neighborhood development and urban vernacular building traditions in late 19th-century St. Louis. The Fred Schmitt Stable is one of the bldgs. in the area that contributes to a potential historic district. Original Use: stable

EXTERIOR FEATURES OF NOTE This is an old brick building with a brick threshold at the main door. It has segmental arches over a small lower window and upper door frame; there is wood infill in the arches. The upper door is missing. The lower window has a thick inset wood sill. There is a gabled tile coping on parapets on the north & south. There are three tall windows, two have segmental arches and the other is in the first story garage door. It has wooden sill. There is also a brick alley and a brick driveway to the east.
