NOTE: The river landing at "Under-the-Hill" is the oldest area of Natchez and was the commercial and transportation center of the entire Natchez region. Six brick buildings from the mid-nineteenth century form an interesting grouping of commercial structures. Also within the District is the site of Fort Rosalie, built in 1730-34 and successively occupied by French, English Spanish, and American troops.
