CALDCLEUCH HOUSE

Four miles north of Lexington, Davidson County, North Carolina

Owner: Miss Betty Conrad

Date of erection: Defaced date brick indicates 1797

Present condition: Fair

Description:

Frams; two stories; gable roof; lean-to across rear; end chimneys brick, Flemish bond; glazed pattern left-hand chimney, rebuilt; front three bays; center door; eash modern; panel shutters remain in rear, as well as beadsd weatherboarding. Original plan--two unequal rooms across front, exterior door entering the larger; small stair hall in center of rear with two small flanking rooms. Walls and ceiling throughout are sheathed, no plaster being used in the house.

Additional data:

Built by Alexander Caldcleuch about 1797 and bought by Jacob Berrier about 1850. Now owned by his granddaughter, Miss Betty Conrad.
