Historical Data:

The church was built in 1839. However, the name was not taken until 1844; neither was the property deeded to the trustees until that year. On September 19, 1844, the Trustees took the name of "The First Presbyterian Church at Plattsburg, in the township of New Hanover, and county of Burlington". The name has since been changed to Sykesville. On the same date, Samuel A. Pancoast and wife deeded to John Black et als, as trustees, the property for a consideration of fifty dollars.
