Location: Route 311, Patterson, Putnam County, New York

Significance: As a domestic outbuilding, this small structure contributes to the character of the Hayt Farmstead, with roof shape and exterior cladding similar to other buildings on the property.

Description: This structure is a one-room square frame shed, set at grade on fieldstone footings. It has a broad-eaved hipped roof with wooden finial, board-and-batten siding and rough plank floor. The walls and ceiling are finished with flush boarding. The only opening is a doorway, in the south wall, with vertical plank door in which is set a four-light window; the door is secured by a simple iron thumblatch.

History: Neither the original function nor the construction date of this building is known. However, its construction and board-and-batten siding link it visually, and probably temporally, with other buildings, such as the bowling alley, which date to the later decades of the 19th century.
