

CROGHAN ISLAND MILL

HAER No. NY-546

- Location: 9897 South Bridge Street, Croghan, Lewis County, New York
- Croghan Island Mill is located at latitude: 43.898554, longitude: -75.392412. The coordinate represents the north end of the mill building. This coordinate was obtained on November 5, 2013, using Google Earth imagery dated May 26, 2013. The Croghan Island Mill location has no restriction on its release to the public.
- Dates of Construction: ca. 1875 (mill complex), 1906 (concrete dam)
- Significance: The Croghan Island Mill is significant as a “rare and substantially intact example of a nineteenth century, water-powered sawmill in New York State.” In addition, the mill retains its original belt-driven machinery and a 1902 water wheel that is only the second one used at the site.¹
- Description: The mill is located on Croghan Island in the Beaver River and consists of the main shop with cold storage and office additions, a wheel house and flume, shed, and a concrete dam. It is accessed by a deck bridge, constructed in 1993 as a replacement to a Pratt, though-truss, steel bridge erected in 1952.
