Location:

626 Fourth Street, Portsmouth, Scioto County, Ohio

Significance:

The Tracey House is an example of the vernacular Italianate architecture of the region.

Description:

This three-bay brick house was originally built as an enlarged half-I. It was later enlarged and elaborated by the addition of a two-story wooden bay with semi-circular arched windows on the west side and a cornice supported by scrolled brackets.

History:

The Tracey House was built circa 1845 and enlarged circa 1880.
