REPRESENTED IN NEGATIVE FILE	H.A.B.S. SURVEY NO. PA-1012	<p><u>History</u> - John Hansell, Blacksmith, acquired the site of this row house on August 12, 1788. Fourteen years later, on May 8, 1802, he sold the property, with a three story brick house, to Christian C. Denckla, Merchant, for £800. After changing owners twice, the house was acquired by William C. Parker, "Ladies Shoe Maker", for \$4,800 in 1846. It remained with Parker, or his estate, until 1900. Demolished 1959.</p> <p><u>Description</u> - A narrow, three-and-a-half story brick city row house with later store front, double brick belt course between second and third stories, gable roof, and single dormer.</p>
