


SIGNIFICANCE (ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL, INCLUDE ORIGINAL USE OF STRUCTURE) Residential Structure in York's historic district. Built during the York Vernacular period between 1870 and 1895. One of literally thousands of worker houses with 2 1/2 stories, moderately pitched roof, dormers, single end chimney, and large arched doorframe.

EXTERIOR FEATURES OF NOTE Single gable-roofed dormer, oriel window and one over one sash, side-hall entry with transom, stripped of all Victorian trim.			
INTERIOR FEATURES OF NOTE (DESCRIBE FLOOR PLANS, IF NOT SKETCHED) No notable features.			
MAJOR ALTERATIONS AND ADDITIONS WITH DATES Oriel window probably added around the late 1800's early 1900's. Frame garage and brick porch probably added in 1950's. Aluminum siding and trim added after 1950.			
PRESENT CONDITION AND USE Fair to good condition, presently a vacant residential dwelling.			
OTHER INFORMATION AS APPROPRIATE Although the basic design is somewhat federal, the house is not federal but just a workers house common to York of the 1800's. The structure in no way compares to the fine Victorian style homes found on East Locust St. to the rear of the property.
