Significance: Located on the same parcel as a contributing structure to
the Water Street Historic District.

Description: This is a two story structure located at the rear of the
property along Willard's Alley. The structures are of wood
frame construction.

The structure is rectangular in shape with gable roof design
that was attached to a two story garage structure creating a
cross gable ell. This is an example of vernacular Early
American Revival that was built as apartments. The exterior
is brick and block on the first floor and the second floor is
covered in "insulbrick". The windows are double hung.
There are no distinguished architectural features. The
building was heavily damaged by a fire on April 3, 1989
and has been vandalized. It is filled with garbage and
debris.

History: Probably built in the 1920's. The architect and builder are
not known. Built as a garage and apartments at the time the
main house was converted to apartments in the 1920's.
