Location: At the intersection of S-38-1132 and S-38-1133, in Eutawville, Orangeburg County, South Carolina

Date of Construction: 1848

Present Use: Church

Significance: Established as a summer chapel by plants who used Eutawville as a summer resort, the Church of the Epiphany served as a chapel of ease for the Rocks Church. It is architecturally significant as an extant example of Greek Revival church architecture.

Constructed of wood and weatherboard, this rectangular structure features board and batten, a steeple, free-standing columns, and pedimented windows. Its interior features include a chancel with palladian windows.
