112 N. Vale St. Brick, rectangular (three-bay front), two stories with coffered brick parapet, three French doors and marquise across front, three windows above with segmental arched mouldings and consoles opening on second-story cast-iron balcony. Built c.1850, when Jefferson was closely related to New Orleans commercially; design of building shows New Orleans precedent. Originally known as Camp Building. Occupied during Civil War by Col. A.G. Malloy, officer in

Quartermasters Dept., Confederate Army, and known as  
Harrison Bank Building. Now automotive supply house.
