Open Air Shed

This structure is a large rectangular wood frame shed located along the north side of the ranch area. The long axis of this structure is oriented roughly east to west. The building has a shed roof of wooden rafters covered by corrugated metal sheeting which slopes downward to the north. The north, east and west sides consist of vertically placed quarter round planking. The north and east sides have no openings. At the north end of the west wall there is a doorway with a steel swinging gate. The entire south side has no planking, as it is open for access to the shed.
