Description:

Chatham was drastically changed in appearance several years ago when it was developed as a modern country place. The porches were removed, the building was painted and an elaborate doorway added. It is a two-story, brick building with a gable roof and end chimneys. The facade is seven bays long, and there are wings and connections.
