LOCATION: West Side of State Route 600, .8 mile North of State Route 778, Clover Vicinity, Halifax County, Virginia

SIGNIFICANCE: As an agricultural outbuilding, this shed contributes to the significance of Edgewood Farm.

DESCRIPTION: This 16' x 17' animal shed is constructed of rough-hewn logs with diamond corner notching. The spaces between the logs are devoid of either daubing or chinking. The exterior walls were originally sheathed with vertical planking, much of which is now missing. The gable ends, framed with pole "studs", are sheathed with weatherboard. Five thick poles, laid north to south at the level of the eaves, may originally have formed a loft. The lower portions of the interior walls are "sealed" with horizontal planking. The shed is roofed with asphalt roll sheeting. An entrance is located in the eastern end of the north wall and a sashless window is located in the southern end of the east wall.

HISTORY: The date of this shed is not known. However, the materials and method of construction suggest it was built in the late 19th or early 20th century.
