LOCATION: West Side of State Route 600, .8 mile North of State Route 778, Clover Vicinity, Halifax County, Virginia

SIGNIFICANCE: This agricultural outbuilding is a contributing element of Edgewood Farm.

DESCRIPTION: This building is composed of an 18' x 12' log shed with an 18' X 11' lean-to attached to the north side. The shed is constructed of peeled, diamond-notched logs without chinking or daubing. The gable peaks are sheathed with horizontal planks. Sawn rafters and thin, plank purlins, sawn from unpeeled logs, form the frame of the gable roof which is covered by sections of seamed metal, sheet metal and rolled asphalt. A doorway with a particleboard "door" and a window opening are centered in the east gable end. The interior, floored with rough planks, is separated into front and rear sections by a half-height horizontal plank partition. The rear section is only accessible by climbing over the partition.

The lean-to, open on the east end, is constructed of unpeeled poles set in the ground with a pole plate, peeled log rafters and seamed metal, sheet metal and rolled asphalt roofing. The exterior is covered with horizontal planking and sheet metal.

HISTORY: The date of this building is unknown.
