BUILDING IDENTIFICATIONS REFLECT NAME AT TIME OF CONSTRUCTION

- WA-165-1 1338-42 PACIFIC AVE. ITALIANATE BUILDING ON LEFT IS THE CITIZENS BANK AND THE IRVING BUILDING (1888-89). A HOMOGENEOUS DESIGN FOR THREE SEPERATE PROPERTY OWNERS, DESIGNED BY CARL AUGUST DARMER.

- WA-165-2 1423 PACIFIC AVE. SANDBERG BUILDING (1907). THIS IS THE OLDEST REINFORCED CONCRETE BUILDING ON THE WEST COAST.

- WA-165-3 SANDBERG BUILDING. AS DESIGNED, THIS BUILDING COULD SUPPORT 16 ADDITIONAL FLOORS.

- WA-165-4 1501-05 PACIFIC AVE. SPRAGUE BUILDING (1889). THIS BUILDING SERVED AS A MODEL FOR MOST OF THE "JOBBER" (FOODSTUFF WHOLESALERS) BUILDINGS IN TACOMA.

- WA-165-5 1502 PACIFIC AVE. WADDELL BUILDING (1890). ORIGINALLY DESIGNED AS A BANK WITH OFFICE SPACE ABOVE.
