WIS. 144	<p><u>History</u> - The main part of the house was constructed about 1845 of hand hewn logs by Philipp Lehner, an early settler in the town of Polk. This type of structure was known locally as a "Block house". The field stone addition was added about 1860. The board and batten finish on the log structure is thought to be an even later addition. that at one time a one story shed roofed porch extended across the front of the house. The house, abandoned as a building in 1909, is in great danger of collapse due to dryrot, neglect and mutilation.

Description - Mid 19th C., hewn log structure, one story ^{and a half} with gable roof, attic and cellar. Field stone addition at rear. The log structure shows fragments of board and batten finish.
