The building is two stories in height and the present condition today is excellent. The structure remains intact as originally built.

The foundation walls are of field stone and the rest of the building, including the roof is of wood. The chimneys are of brick.

All that can be said of this structure is that it is typical of hundreds of other farm houses which dot the state of Wisconsin. Built by Vermonters, who brought with them, traditions of the true Colonial from their home state, it represents the best of this work. It's true to type Colonial lines are an immediate delight to all who pass. The primitive construction of the out buildings and of the barns adds much to the charm of this group of farm structures.
