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Location: Wheeling, Ohio County, West Virginia

USGS Wheeling, W.VA. - Ohio Quadrangle Universal  
Transverse Mercator Coordinates:

Significance: Late 19th Century frame house that is a  
contributing structure to the Wheeling Island  
Historic District.

Description: This two story frame rectangular block house that  
faces Zane Street, has a low hipped roof. One  
and two story additions have been added to the  
rear. This house has a full width front porch  
which was built a few decades later than the  
house. Bracket, incised angled frieze, and  
decorative window heads ornament the facade. The  
house has a full basement. Alterations include;  
iron rail on the front porch and a modern door.  
This house is a mate to 184 Zane Street.

History: Date of Construction: ca. 1890. According to Ohio  
County deed records the first deed of ownership  
appears prior to 1919 when it was owned by John  
Joseph Kamm, a widower. The date that Mr. Kamm  
obtained the house is unknown. In 1919 he sold  
the property to Minnie M. Lewis, who owned the  
property until 1942. In that year the house went  
into the hands of Louis and Pearl Breitingner who  
gave it up the following year to Joseph and Etta  
Gray who kept the house until 1946 when it was  
sold to George Vlahos, who also owned 176 Zane at  
one time. When Mr. Vlahos died in February of  
1965, the house passed to his wife Georgia Vlahos  
who in turn sold it the same year to Russell B.  
and Gertrude Berry. When Mrs. Berry died in  
1976, Mr. Berry sold the house to Sarah Means who  
kept the house until 1991 when it was purchased  
by the West Virginia Division of Highways. 180  
Zane became a contributing structure of the  
Wheeling Island Historic District in April, 1992.






