Description - One story, primitive board-and batten construction. Outside chimney of native stone with well shaped blocks (hand hewn) tapers from above fireplace to unusual "Cupola" at top. This "Cupola" is like a small belfry with roughly rounded openings, or arches, giving a picturesque architectural touch to the otherwise rough building.
