SIGNIFICANCE (ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL, INCLUDE ORIGINAL USE OF STRUCTURE) Established by Congress in 1851 as a home for old and disabled soldiers. Funds were supplied by Gen. Winfield Scott out of the indemnity paid to him by Mexico in the Mexican War. Located on one of highest points of land in the city, making it a site for pleasure excursions during the late 19th-early 20th Centuries.
