THE SULLIVAN HOUSE

MADISON, INDIANA

Jeremiah Sullivan was born in Rockingham County, Va. in 1794. He was the son of Thos. L. and Margaret Irwin Sullivan. His father, Thos. L. Sullivan, was born in Ireland and his mother's father, Irwin, was born in Scotland.

In 1817, he married Charlotte Rudesel Cutler of Virginia and in the same year moved to Madison, Indiana. Eleven children were born of this union.

In 1818, he erected a residence in Madison, Indiana, which is still standing, in good condition, and known as the Sullivan Home. While a member of the Indiana Legislature, he suggested the name "Indianapolis" for the new State Capital. At first, the suggestion met with ridicule, but after much discussion was adopted. He was a member of the early Indiana Supreme Court, consisting of three Justices, Blackford, Dewey and Sullivan. He was a graduate of William and Mary College of Williamsburg, Virginia.

He was the great grandfather of Reginald H. Sullivan, the present Mayor of Indianapolis, and the grandfather of Thos. L. Sullivan, who was Mayor of Indianapolis from 1889 to 1893.
