HAER NY-126-1

View from southeast corner, Pleasant and Canisteo Streets, Building #4. This general elevation places the complex in its surrounding environment, and demonstrates the relative size of the complex. This view also shows the variety of building sizes and heights which make up the complex.

Interior view of offices in Building #4. Photo shows the woodworking in the offices. Wall paneling is six feet high; spindle dividers and paneling are made of maple.

View from northeast corner, Canisteo and Spruce Streets. Photo shows the garage area (Building #5) with sawtooth roofline and front elevation of Buildings #6 and #1.
