Significance: The Animal Clinic provided space for a veterinary treatment center that treated animals owned by military and dependent personnel.

Project Information: Building No. 2630 at Plattsburgh Air Force Base (AFB) is being documented in accordance with HAER standards to mitigate for the potential adverse effects of transferring deed of title to the property from federal ownership. The property transfer is a result of the disposal and reuse of Plattsburgh AFB, pursuant to the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Act of 1993. The mitigation is a stipulation of a Programmatic Agreement (PA) among the U.S. Air Force, the New York State Historic Preservation Officer, and the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (October 2000).

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Summary Description of Animal Clinic (Building No. 2630)

Layout

Building No. 2630 is a one-story, reinforced concrete block building with a nearly flat roof. The building is rectangular in plan and measures 44'-0" x 35'-0". The west elevation has a partially enclosed, shed roof vestibule that was added shortly after the building's construction. To the left of the vestibule are two large windows, each with twelve lights. To the right of the vestibule is a band of three awning windows. All windows in this building have precast concrete sills. The south elevation retains the "Veterinary Services" signage.

Alterations/Additions

Other than the vestibule on the west side, believed to have been constructed circa 1974, Building No. 2630 has had no major alterations or additions.

Function

Building No. 2630 was used as a veterinary clinic.

Significance


Building No. 2630 provided space to support the military dog program, which was vital to the Plattsburgh AFB mission.


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Location Map for Animal Clinic, Building No. 2630
